"yes has had an amazing four years since coming into bloom in Newton Heath. Following on from opening up a base at The Hive in Higher Blackley in 2015, we are now setting down new roots in Collyhurst too. We're looking forward to furthering our work with all those communities to help them find jobs, opportunities and skills.

"We're continuing to work with partners in the area, particularly with the military charity Walking With the Wounded this year, helping ex-servicemen and women back into work. We also have some new funders who've helped make our Collyhurst expansion possible, including the Clothworkers Foundation, who provided the IT for our new base.

"It's not just **yes** that's growing, either. We're helping start-up businesses; giving them seed funding by way of grants. We're hoping that we'll help small businesses to bloom in the area, bringing muchneeded enterprise.

"One of our biggest achievements this year was at Manchester's 'Be Proud' awards where we won the 'Community Force' category. This made us feel really humble because we were up against a number of nominees who had supported people following the arena attack.

"We're looking forward to the next 12 months; there'll be lots of opportunities for us to grow and develop our services even further. We're excited to work with more local residents to bring even more success to the areas that we work in."

- We held an event for International Women's Day at our Higher Blackley branch. Local female entrepreneurs shared their stories and gave advice, while the Google Bus pulled up to give people digital help
- We won the 'Community Force' category at the Be Proud awards. The event – run by Manchester City Council – rewards citizens and groups that make a real difference in the city, so it's an achievement we're extremely proud of
- We won 'Best Partnership' for our work with Northwards Housing in Manchester's Financial Inclusion Awards. The money advice surgery Northwards delivers from our centres means we can give debt and welfare advice alongside our specialist employment support at a time when it is needed most

- We continued to work closely with the Training Brokers, providing clients with a range of courses to broaden their skills

We use the Housing Associations' Charitable Trust (HACT) social impact tool to help us to evaluate some of our activities that are difficult to put a monetary value on.

This is called our 'social value' and we calculated our activities here at **yes** to be worth £12,984,426. The figure is based on the equivalent amount of money that would have the same effect on someone's life as the service being valued.

So, in addition to the value of the employment they get, it takes into account lots of other positives such as improved physical and mental health, increased confidence and the benefits of internet access.

Our annual running costs are £304,108, which means every £1 spent = more than £42 of social value.

With funding from Social Investment Business, we've been working with Crellin Consulting on streamlining the way we support people. Debbie Crellin brings a wealth of experience of business planning in the sector and has spent time with our staff and board to help us achieve this by December 2018.



WHY IT PAYS T SAY yes

From finding that first job to making a career move, we've guided lots of people over the last year to get where they want to go. Here are just a few examples:

Vincent McGuinness (right), 21, of Newton Heath, now works for Northwards Housing's Estate Services.

"Pretty much everything that I've had in the past has been seasonal," he said.

"I thought I'd give it a go with the **yes** *centre and it's the best thing I've ever done to get a job. I went in there and within two weeks, I'd got a job pretty much. Nothing else matches it."*

Jonathan Wilmott (below left), 37, of Newton Heath, has become a chef de partie.

"I came in to **yes** to update my CV. I thought they were all very helpful; I wasn't sure what to put on it and they helped me a lot," he said.

"They helped me to apply for a better role as a chef, moving from a demi-chef to a chef de partie, which is more money and better for me."



Joshua McCartney (below right), 19, of Newton Heath, is an apprentice electrician with Mears.

"**yes** helped me physically by helping me apply for jobs, but the biggest thing was they helped me mentally," he said. "When I thought I was never going to get the job, they were always there to tell me 'you've got a good chance'.

"If you're looking for a job, you've got to be daft not to use yes."



Zena Bell (below), 33, of Hulme, works as a rent caseworker for Northwards Housing.

"With my last employer, I was there for 10 years and had no responsibility; it got very demoralising. Now I feel like I can progress," she said.

"**yes** gave me a lot of support to apply for an apprenticeship. The staff are dead nice and friendly. From there, I built up my experience and successfully applied to become a rent caseworker."





Alex Ritchie (above), 18, of Higher Blackley, has started a business administration apprenticeship with Concept Metal.

"I wasn't really enjoying college and I just thought that I'd like a more practical form of education. I was applying at home but not really finding much success," he said.

"**yes** helped me to apply for the right apprenticeship and gave me encouragement and an opportunity to volunteer with them. This gave me a lot of confidence as I got to help people coming into the office."


